

Life Chapters

In August of 2017 my life will change significantly. For the past 22 years, I have been a parent with a child in the home. At the end of August, my youngest son will be leaving and spending the year away in India. As the saying goes, Christie and I will be empty nesters. There is a part of me that wants to shout and have a party, while another part of me mourns the end of possibly the most meaningful chapter of my life – that of being a parent. Regardless of how I feel though, grieving or celebrative, change is happening and a new chapter in my life is starting.

This image of seeing life as a book broken up into chapters is helpful. Chapters represent seasons of life. A chapter ends and another begins when there is a significant change that profoundly impacts how life is lived and experienced. Seeing life as a book with chapters helps to visualize, adjust, and purposefully choose how to begin anew. Every person will have certain chapters of life such as childhood, school years, and a first job. Some of life chapters are wonderfully joyful, such as falling in love, a season of deep friendships, and the adventure of early parenthood. Yet, not all of life chapters are joyful. Each book will contain chapters of losing a loved one, experiencing failure, and the struggle of living in a world of constant change. Chapter endings and beginnings represent important times of transition that need to be prayerfully reflected upon and God-led.

Here are some of the things to do when you find yourself at the end of one of life's chapters and starting a new one.

1. Reflect and give thanks for the joy and happiness you have received. The practice of giving thanks is one of the primary ways that we train our hearts to recognize the Spirit of God at work in our lives. Thankfulness is an act of faith even during the most hurtful times. 2. If the ending chapter is filled with pain, hurt or loss, then trust the Lord with it. The Biblical word for trusting the Lord with these things that hurt us is "forgiveness." The act of forgiveness is the prayerful act of releasing the things (not just people) that have done you harm. 3. See the new chapter as the opportunity to

See the new chapter as the opportunity to live life in a new way. Purposefully choose

to redirect your steps in accordance to the knowledge and wisdom God has granted you in the last chapter. The Biblical word for this is "repentance." Usually the idea of repentance is used in the context of turning away from sin (and it is that) but also think of repentance as making a conscious choice to live anew. The start of a new

chapter may include decisions to deepen friendships, praise more, and laugh more. If the heart is purposefully turned towards God's good will and desires for you, that turning is what repentance is all about.

4. Spend time thinking and praying about the future. What is upon your heart? Where do you sense the Lord leading? What possibilities are in front of you? The Biblical word for this prayerful look towards the future is "hope." Our hope in the Lord is clearly defined as our life with Him for all of eternity, but that future heavenly hope percolates into our world and life now. God is on the move and you are invited to join Him.

Hebrews 12:2 tells us that Jesus is "the author and perfecter of our faith." His hand is at work in your life in creating a masterpiece, a classic, a life worth living for all of eternity.

Service Updates:

Food Pantry: In June the Food Pantry continued to increase in the number of families they are serving each month. It seems that every month there is more of a demand for assistance in our community. New Baptist Church has been blessed enough to continue to provide even with the increasing need, and they serve with a smile and a joyful heart. Our Food Pantry ministry continues to look for help every week but

especially on the 3rd Tuesday of every month as that is the day food is delivered. If you have a truck that can help pick up the deliveries or you are willing to help unload the trucks, please see **Joyce Mannon** for details on how to become involved.

In addition to the large food delivery on the 3rd Tuesday of each month, the Food Pantry is now also adding an additional box of food for 30 senior citizens each month. One month's box included 2 grape juices, 2 tomato juices, 2 crisp rice boxes, 2 packages of spaghetti, 1 peanut butter, 2 cans of chicken, 2 milks, 1 box of dry milk, 2 spaghetti sauces, 2 carrots, 1 pear and 1 applesauce. This is just an extra way to serve our seniors in the area. The senior adult must pick up their box on the 3rd Tuesday each month to continue

to receive this extra box. If they do not, they will no longer receive it and someone on the waiting list will be given the box. The Food Pantry is always looking for volunteers, but especially on the 3rd Tuesday each month.

As you are traveling this summer, please collect the small toiletry items provided in your hotel. The Food Pantry uses these in their hygiene kits. If you stay multiple days collect them each day. Donations can be dropped off at the mission display board in the back of the sanctuary.

Time to Fill the Backpacks – The Food Pantry is committed to making sure children do not go hungry on the weekend. Each week during the school year, we fill 50 bags with food for children at Highlawn Elementary. Each bag always has 8 items – 2 fruits (cups of applesauce & fruit), 2 drinks, 2 lunch items (macaroni & cheese, Spaghettios, ravioli, peanut butter), 2 breakfast items (pop-tarts & cereal). All items must be in individual packages, bags or cans. Pull tabs are best (can openers are hard for little ones to use). After the 8 items are in the bag, other items are added – chips, granola bars, pretzels, etc. With school starting August 10, we need to restock our shelves. If you can donate any of these items, it would be appreciated. 50 bags a week requires lots of help!!

Cambodia's Child Sex Industry Is Dwindling—And They Have Christians to Thank

Sek Saroeun first read the Bible at a Phnom Penh bar where young girls were illegally sold for sex. The Buddhist law student worked as a DJ at the pub while serving as an undercover informant for the human rights group International Justice Mission. He scanned the room to scope out suspects as Michael Jackson boomed over the speakers. Someone lent him a Bible which he began to read while in the DJ booth. He converted to Christianity and became one of the country's top lawyers prosecuting perpetrators of underage trafficking.

Čambodia had turned into a cheap, shabby hotbed for sex tourism in the decades after its notorious genocide and resulting civil unrest. Excited, disgusted, and afraid of being found out during his capital city spying, Sek repeated Romans 12:12 to himself: Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. Over time, "fear led to longing; longing led to transformation that is unimaginable," he told colleagues a decade later, explaining how he became a Christian and the group's top lawyer in Cambodia. "God didn't just change me," said Sek. "He also changed a family, a community, a nation."

Between 2004 and 2015, Sek and his team watched the prevalence of underage girls in busy brothels, roadside massage parlors, and neon-lit karaoke bars steadily drop as they partnered with Cambodia's anti-trafficking police and social services to rescue more than 500 victims and take about 140 child sex trafficking cases to court.

The result: In 2015, underage girls composed about 2 percent of women available for commercial sex in major cities—only a quarter of their share a few years earlier. Before the project began, the Cambodian government estimated that girls under 18 accounted for as much as 30 percent of the industry.

Along rows of tiny shops, Agape International Missions has taken over brothels, turning them into a church, clinic, shelter, and factory in an effort to revitalize the once-sordid area. The community, once described as the "armpit of Cambodia," has been transformed.
