Remembering God's Steadfast Love and Faithfulness - (Proverbs 3:3)

How good is your memory? Have you ever forgotten something that you should not have forgotten (and you can't say "I don't remember")? I have. I have forgotten many things like events and meetings that I had promised to attend, names of people, and important dates. I always feel bad when I forget something that I should have remembered. When there is something that I must remember, I do several things to help remind me. I will set multiple alarms on my phone; I will write it down on a to-do list, record it in my calendar, and even leave a note regarding the event or item on my desk. Having these constant reminders is critical not to forget very This is what the first part of important things. Proverbs 3 is about

Proverbs 3 begins by telling us, the reader, that there are certain things that we must be sure never to forget. Verse one reads, "My son, do not forget my teaching, but let your heart keep my commandments (Proverbs 3:1)." What do you think

is the first specific thing that we are told to remember? The list of items that we are to remember begins in verse 3, which reads, "Let not steadfast love and faithfulness forsake you; bind them around your neck; write them on the tablet of your heart (Proverbs 3:3)." What is the first thing that you should always remember and never forget? It is the steadfast love of God and his faithfulness.

People most often forget God's love and faithfulness when they fail and mess up. It is so easy to become discouraged in this life. When a person sins, they sometimes think that they are not lovable.

Thus, they will hide the sin, cover it over, pretend that it is not there. And here is the problem. When people seek to hide sin, it sticks in their mind. Isn't that weird? The things we want to forget we can't, and the things we should remember often become forgotten. The Lord gives us a way for sin to no longer reign in the mind as a constant reminder of our brokenness and failure. Psalm 103:12 reads, "as far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our transgressions from us." This verse does not literally say that we forget our sin, but that rather, our sin is no longer always before us. That sin is no longer stuck in the mind, no longer defining our actions and feelings, but has become separated from us as far as the east is from the west. How does one

push sin, failure, regret, guilt, and shame out of the mind? It begins by remembering the steadfast love and faithfulness of God.

Look back at verse three and notice what we are told regarding God's love and faithfulness. "Bind them around your neck, write


them down on the tablet of the heart." These are actions of remembering and never forgetting. This image of binding something on the neck and writing it on the heart suggests that no matter where a person goes or what they think, there is a constant remembering of God's love and faithfulness. We are to hang onto this knowledge of God's love and faithfulness, especially when we hear whispers that seek to pull us away. Find a way today to bind upon you and write upon your heart the steadfast love of God and His faithfulness.

August marks the beginning of many Training Camps. Players coaches and fans get excited as they look ahead to the coming season. Think about all that begins in August: Fall sports teams begin practice, the band begins practice for the fall competition season, College and professional teams begin training. In each of these camps the coaches or directors go back and emphasize the basics and that's what is practiced before they ever add anything else.

The exciting plays we see on the football field during the season began with basic blocking and tackling drills in August. The beautiful music we hear and intricate marching steps we see at halftime and in band competitions began with scales and drills in August.
