Food Pantry: In the month of June the Food Pantry served 392 families, 957 individuals and gave out 128 hygiene kits.

Haiti: Gail is planning to lead a small medical team back to Haiti in September. The plan is to go back with a larger group in the Spring over Marshall's Spring Break. So stay tuned for more info.

School Supplies: We are currently collecting school supplies to distribute directly to Highlawn Elementary, Huntington East Middle School and Huntington High School. This will allow the school to distribute to students in need throughout the school year. You may drop off any supplies in the back of the sanctuary or you may donate money and we will shop for you. The first weekend in August is TAX FREE shipping so take advantage of that sale. **Please bring supplies by Aug 6.** Here is what we are collecting:

VBS Offering: During Vacation Bible School our kiddos collected an offering to purchase soccer balls and pumps for our Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes. Over 4 days these students brought in enough money to purchase 160 soccer balls AND pumps!!! Praise the Lord for the generosity of our youngest. Because of their giving 160 children around the world will be able to hear the Gospel!!!

Missionary Updates: Star and David Canterbury (Bridges International at Marshall University) led a team of 30 students from around the country on a summer mission to Daytona Beach. This was a full circle moment for David who went on his very first summer mission in Daytona in 2010. Evangelism is one of the main focuses of summer mission with Cru. Between the staff and students 440 conversations were initiated. 282 of those transitioned into spiritual conversations. 121 times the gospel was shared and 5 people decided to follow Jesus!!!

JD and Rhonda Reed (Bolivia)

- -House of Hope was able to host their first mission team in 3 years!!! With help from a local team they were able to build an extension on a growing church including bathrooms. The extension allowed the church to double their capacity.
- -Mobile Medical and Dental Clinics have been very busy so far this year. They have been able to provide 2 dental and 1 medical clinic each month in various cities. At each clinic local doctors and dentists typically treat 40-50 patients. That time is followed by a late lunch and fellowship with the local pastor and church leaders.
- -The Palmer Seminary Masters of Theological Studies in Latino/a Ministries (MTS LMIN) has a graduation to remember. Usually the MTS LMIN program held its own local graduation in the countries of the students that had graduated. This Spring they had 13 students from Latin America make the trip to the US to join the larger graduation. That day students from the US, El Salvador and Brazil joined together to celebrate.
- For the current students it has been a busy first half of the year. The MTS LMIN program has hosted 3 weeks of residency in St. David's, PA, Mexico City, Mexico and Campinas, Brazil.
- -Another Graduation. The Reed's son, Nathan, graduated from high school. He will be attending WVU in the Fall to study social work.
- -Family News due to health issues JD and Rhonda will be moving back to WV. They will be continuing to work with International Ministries remotely. Rhonda's ongoing health issues (uncertainty with all of the traveling JD does for the MTS LMIN program) and JD is in need of a new cochlear implant make this decision a necessary one. Please pray for them as they transition. But know they are not leaving their ministry; it will just look different.

From Pastor Robin Crouch

In 2022 I set a personal goal of learning to do something creative with my hands. I had made my living with my mind and my mouth as I studied and preached. I asked the Lord to help me find something creative I could do with my hands. Some years ago, a church member in Charlotte, MI, gave me an olivewood pen he turned on a lathe. That sparked something in me and I began to watch videos and talk with wood turners. With encouragement from Becky, I purchased a lathe and started. I soon found out that it was harder than I thought but I was getting better. I started meeting with Ervin Jones, the wood turner at Heritage Farm, and he has been a great resource, teacher and friend on this journey. Once I started, I was hooked and began to think of people for whom I might make and gift a pen. I ended up turning and giving away over 100 pens.

Earlier this year Fred Friar, the broom maker at Heritage Farm, retired. I was asked if I would like to learn to make brooms. I smiled at myself and asked the Lord if this was another way I was to learn to use my hands. I watched some videos and met with Fred for a number of lessons and now I am making brooms at the farm. It has been an enjoyable learning experience filled with mistakes and do-overs. Fred has been a valuable resource.

I have also recently replaced the carburetor on my weed eater. It was not difficult but for one who had never done something like that it was daunting. I watched a number of videos and got it done and it runs again.

I share these stories to say that in all three I learned from videos what to do and had no real interaction with another person. I learned but something was lacking. There is no substitute for the wisdom, friendship and knowledge you can gain from personal contact and instruction. To have Ervin and Fred as skilled resources gives me confidence to try new things because they can help if I get stuck.

My concern is that it is so easy to isolate ourselves from community and interaction with others. We are made to be in community with each other and not just through a device on a screen. We miss so much when we are not with each other. Let me say that I love face timing with my granddaughters in Louisiana but that pales in comparison to being with them.

It is important for us to be together in worship and ministry. I appreciate the technology that allows us to live stream our services but there is no substitute for being physically present.

I have rambled on and on here but there is a point. Many of you know that I love the internet and it is filled with knowledge but I cannot let it become a substitute for personal relationships. It simply fails in comparison.



I look forward to seeing and talking with you as we worship, minister and play together making a difference for Jesus.



Garee Ransbottom, whom we last heard from when his and Mary's basement flooded after a huge rain, was pictured in a 4-picture-feature in the July 6 edition of the Herald-Dispatch, standing

in their front yard on Enslow Blvd. where he had placed 50 American flags in honor of U.S. service members. Both of his brothers served in the Army, his younger brother having died in Vietnam. Each flag stands for one of the 50 states in the Union.

The 300 participants will take part in a competition in April 2024 to present what they have done to transform their civic classrooms.
