Remembering What Jesus Fulfills

One of the common themes that will be proclaimed in churches around the world this Christmas season is how the birth of Jesus is a fulfillment of Old Testament prophecy. Here are some of the fulfilled prophecies at the time of Jesus' birth.

- He was born of a virgin (Isaiah 7:14)
- Born in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2)
- The weeping over the children killed by Herod (Jeremiah 31:15)
- Jesus escapes into Egypt (Hosea 11:1)

Going further, I have read studies of the Bible that describe how Jesus fulfilled 353 Old Testament prophecies during His life. Among these prophecies are such things as Jesus being a descendant of David; performing signs of healing; speaking in parables; ministry in Galilee; greeted as a king while entering Jerusalem; and His crucifixion (See Psalm 22 and Isaiah 53). A mathematician, Dr. Peter Stoner, calculated the odds of one person fulfilling just 8 of the Old Testament prophecies about the Messiah. According to Dr. Stoner, the probability of just 8 of the prophecies being fulfilled is 1 in 10¹⁷ (1 in 100,000,000,000,000,000)!!! This is amazing!! Can you imagine the odds of just one person fulfilling all 353 Old Testament Prophecies?

In talking about the Old Testament prophecies, we need to remember that the prophets did not just talk about future events, but also talked about those things for which our heart longs. Isaiah 61 is a perfect example of the things that our heart desires. Here is a short summary of the promises found in Isaiah 61.

- Healing for the broken hearted
- Liberty to those in bondage

- Comfort to those that mourn
- The presence of God in our midst
- The doing away of evil
- Beauty instead of ashes
- Gladness instead of mourning
- Ruined cities finding new life and vitality
- Past failures and mistakes finding second chances

- Broken relationships being made whole

These are the things for which we pray.

Isaiah 61 is the intersection of our heart's longing and God's promises.

In the Gospels, Jesus, the one who fulfills over 350 recognized prophecies, never spoke about His fulfillment of them as He was doing them except for one time. It was when He was in the Synagogue of His home town, Nazareth, and after He read Isaiah 61 (see the above themes). After He had read Isaiah 61, He sat down and said to those there *"Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing"* (Luke 4:21).

The one prophecy that Jesus literally said about Himself – "I fulfill this" – is the prophecy about the deep longings of our soul.

The longing for the healing of our brokenness, freedom from our bondage, redemption of ruined lives, and of the rejoicing of the soul is fulfilled in Jesus. It is to these things that Jesus declared to the world – **"Today, I have filled this in your hearing!"**

As you enter this holiday season, I hope you do so marveling at all of what Jesus has done and how He has fulfilled prophecy, but most of all I hope you spend time marveling and giving thanks at how Jesus has fulfilled the longings of your heart.

We were able to provide a delicious Thanksgiving meal to 141 people. Children had a blast making crafts and playing games. Books were provided for all age groups ranging from The Bernstein Bears God Loves You, God's Promises for Kids and the Bible were a few. Children were also given a tote full of goodies, and adults won prizes through a raffle. A wonderful time was had by all.

Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes: Thank you to everyone who filled a shoebox. We had right around 200 shoeboxes collected this year!!! That means not only do 200 kids receive a gift, possibly for the first time, but more importantly 200 kids get to hear the Good News of Christ. They will be able to hear that the creator of the universe loves them enough to send His son to earth. FOOD PANTRY **Food Pantry:** In October the food pantry continued to server our community in a mighty way. The number of families/individuals this ministry is able to serve is amazing. In September they were able to serve 353 families, totaling 781 people made up of 224 children, 414 adults, 143 senior adults! 250 backpacks were given to students at Highlawn Elementary School to help those students have food to eat over each weekend. In addition to food 33 hygiene kits were distributed and 30 senior citizen boxes. Our food pantry ministry continues to look for help every week but especially on the 3rd Tues of every month as that is the day food is delivered. If you have a truck that can help pick up the deliveries or you are willing to help unload the trucks please see **Joyce Mannon** for details on how to become involved. In addition to the large food delivery on the 3rd Tuesday of each month, the food pantry is now also adding an additional box of food for 30 senior citizens each month.

Giving Opportunities:

Christmas Offering: Each year we at NBC have a special offering throughout the month of December. The total of the offering will be split between two ministries: The Weirton Christian Center and the Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering.



The Weirton Christian Center, located in Weirton, WV, has been providing care for children in the community free of charge for 94 years. Some of their ministries include After-school programs, RAZE program, Literacy programs, emphasis on fitness and nutrition, transportation, God time, donations of school supplies, entrepreneurial program, community garden, sign language and singing/dance group, music lessons, fenced-in basketball court and playground, summer

programs, visitation room for parental visits for children in foster care, and scholarships for summer camps. As you can see this is a very busy ministry. In 2006, they were supporting approximately 40 students. In 2015, that number reached 277. They have recently broken ground on their Build-A-Building Campaign. They are building a new facility all under one roof that allows for the increase in children they currently serve and the increase that may come in the future. "The plans are developed for a two-story building at our current location on Elm Street. We have given the funds to purchase the property adjacent to the Christian Center." (www.weirtonchristiancenter.com) Their presence has a huge impact in the community of Weirton. Lives are being changed and children know they are loved by the workers but more importantly by God by attending their programs. Each ministry has their own variety, ranging from purchasing an animal (or a portion of one) for a family to raise and make a living from to paying for schooling for a child to providing clean water by buying a well. For example, you can purchase a pig, which can provide up to 16 piglets a year that can then be eaten or sold for profit and the manure boosts crop productivity. Heifer International has a Passing on the Gift agreement that a family that receives an animal will then pass on one offspring to another family in need.

Whatever your traditions are; wherever you celebrate them; be sure you center them on Christ.

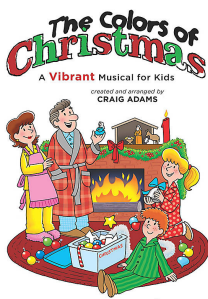

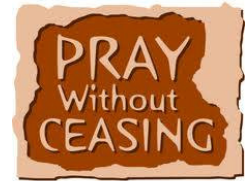

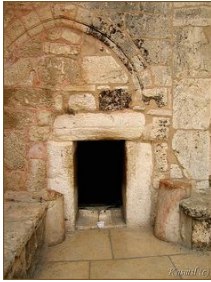

Bethlehem's Church of the Nativity, which marks the likely spot of Jesus' birth, has a four-foot-high entrance. Throughout the centuries, the height of the entrance has been lowered twice: once to prevent looting and once to keep out camel- and horse-riders.

Because visitors must bow as they enter, this has become known as the Door of Humility. It's a reminder of the reverent, submissive posture our hearts should take as we approach our newborn Lord and Savior. It's also a reminder that Jesus is the narrow door (Luke 13:24) — the only path to eternal life.
