Living Filled

Growing up in the Northwest, my family spent many summer holidays at the mountain lake of Wallowa. I can still remember the ice cold and crystal waters in which we spent hours swimming. Normally, a number of little creeks maintained the depth and purity of Wallowa Lake and kept the single outflow always flowing from its overflow. Some summers though, we had drought, which meant that there was

no water entering the lake. When no water was replenishing the lake, its clear waters became murky, its sweet smell of mountain flowers turned to the smell of algae, and the constant flowing outflow dried up.

The mountain lake of Wallowa is a good image to describe

what it looks like to live this life being a disciple of Jesus. When a believer is honestly seeking the Lord, they find their lives filled with the waters of God's grace. The ordinary ordained waters that fill our lives are such things as prayers, Holy Scripture, and the community of believers. When we seek God and wait in these things ours lives find refreshment to the point of overflowing into the lives of others.

Sometimes I hear people talk about being burned out, or dried up, language that kind of describes what Wallowa Lake is like when there is a drought. The feeling is that they just cannot give of themselves any more, so they pull out of ministry, even out of church,

and sometimes from Christ all together. Their souls have become dried, hard, smelly and murky. How does a Christian keep him or herself from drying up? The answer is very simply; keep waiting in the streams of flowing grace. Keep your soul open to real prayer, faithful ingesting of God's word, and courageous fellowship among believers. God of course works in many ways, and there are many creeks that help keep the mountain lake pure and overflowing, but God's Word, prayer, and communion

are the major tributaries.

How is it with your soul? What is the depth? What is the purity? What is the inflow? What is the outflow?

Do you want to do great things for God and His Kingdom? If so, begin first with simply filling your own soul with God. We (believers of Jesus) are more like lakes than

rivers, for in lakes there is always an overflow coming out, but also a deep reservoir that never goes dry.

"Whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." (John 4:14)



This is the most effective tool I have found that helps people understand how the whole Bible fits together and tells the Upper Story of God's plan for reaching us.



Church Board of Finance Report for 2018

God continues to bless the ministry of New Baptist Church. For the calendar year ended December 31, 2018:

- Offerings to the General Fund were sufficient for us to:

 (1) pay all of our creditors timely, (2) set aside \$30,000 for capital improvements, (3) pay the staff a Christmas bonus, (4) pay an additional \$25,000 on our mortgage; and (5) add \$4,315 to the general fund account.
- Since the offerings were more than anticipated, we able to put an additional \$2,578 into missions. (The mission true-up for 2018 was \$61,578. The mission budget was \$59,000.)
- Offerings to the Building Fund were \$21,743. We spent \$8,593 to purchase a floor scrubber.
- The Food Pantry had a \$5,307 surplus for the year (revenue minus expenditures).


