Living by Faith

"By faith Noah, being warned by God concerning events as yet unseen, in reverent fear constructed an ark for the saving of his household. By this, he condemned the world and became an heir of the righteousness that comes by faith (Hebrews 11:7)."

What a remarkable verse. Note the two things Noah did by faith. First, Noah built a giant boat for a flood that the world had never seen before because of God's warning. He did something not because he understood but because he obeyed. I am sure he (and his family) was delighted that he built the ark when the rains came. Second, Noah condemned the world, which is a way of saying, Noah chose to live according to God's way over and above the world's way. Because of living according to God's way, he "became an heir of the righteousness that comes by faith."

We, like Moses, are called to live by faith. Most people do not live by faith, though. Instead, they live by what "feels right," or according to how they are pressured by the world or because of certain traditions. Living by faith means trusting the Lord and living according to His Word, even, like Moses, when one does not understand. The New Testament is full of commands that are often hard to understand and do not match the way the world tells us to live. Commands like "Love your enemies," "Forgive the people who hurt you," and "Give thanks in all circumstances." These are not easy commands! In fact, some of the commands in the Bible seem difficult, unreasonable, unrealistic, unachievable, or even impossible. But when God says things like, "You should save sex for marriage," He is not being mean. He says it because he knows best and knows what will make you happy more than you do.

Every time God tells you to do something, it is a test of your faith. The question is, "do you trust God, or do you trust your gut? Do you trust the Word, or do you trust the world?"

These are good questions to ask as we start a new year. How will you answer

them? Will you trust God, or will you do what you think is right, regardless of God's direction? Will you trust the Word of God, or will you trust what the world says you should do? As a child, my parents told me to do things that I often did not want to, like clean my room. Sometimes I would ask in defiance, "why? It is my room (technically not true since it was their house. This logic escaped me at the time). The response I would receive to the question "why" was often, "Because I said so!" After many years of hindsight, I can say they

years of hindsight, I can say they were both right and wise to tell me to clean my room. God is like this. Throughout all of life, God says, "I want you to do this," and our human reaction often is, "why? That does not make sense." God will say, "Because I said so." It is a test. Faith is believing when you don't see it, AND it is obeying when you don't understand it. If you do not learn to obey, you'll miss so many blessings in the life that God has in store for you. But if you learn to do what God tells you to do without question, even when it seems absurd and the exact opposite of your natural tendency, then you're going to grow in faith, and you're going to get blessed. Let's make responding in faith our focus for this New Year!

There is an imaginary line we step over at midnight on December 31st each year. That line feels like an abrupt ending that opens a door to the unknown. Some of us hope for something better in that unknown and some of us fear what the next year will bring. Perhaps we feel both?

There have been many times in each of our lives when an end to something, either good or bad, left us standing before the unknown and wondering just how it could all work out. Can you think of some examples of those times in your own life?

I awoke this morning thinking of the Magi and trying to put myself in their shoes. Perhaps we have all felt that restless stirring in our hearts that made us realize we were being called to something... or to someone. Perhaps we have all lived in those moments when we couldn't rest until that change was made.

- May we step out boldly into the unknown and make the necessary changes to be obedient to God. ("Trust in the

 will make straight your paths." Proverbs 3:5-6)
- May we realize that each of our callings have eternal implications. Our obedience changes lives and those lives will
 continue to change other lives throughout history. Your calling, in whatever you do, is life changing! ("You did not
 choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so
 that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you." John 15:16)
- May we open our hearts and minds so that even in the small ordinary moments we feel God working in and through
 us, using us to weave those moments of our lives into a life with eternal significance. ("as we look not to the things
 that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are
 unseen are eternal." 2 Corinthians 4:18)
- May we, even in the hardest moments of this new year, realize that we matter to God, and He is with us in all things. His plan is always good! ("The Lord is good to all, and His tender mercies are over all His works." Psalm 145:9)

Eyes to See And Ears to Hear

Often in the scriptures we see the phrases, "eyes to see" and "ears to hear." These most often are speaking to spiritual understanding of things. Having our spiritual eyes and ears opened to see and hear what the Lord is showing and saying to us is a wonderful way to live. This awakening in our spirits lifts us to new heights in our walk and relationship with the Lord.

Let me illustrate with a more temporal experience. I have worn hearing aids for over 15 years. I knew I was having difficulty, but it became acutely clear when I could not hear the whisper of a lady who was dying of cancer. I immediately scheduled a test and then ordered my first hearing aids. I was amazed at what I had been missing and had accepted as normal. For the first time in years, I heard birds chirping and leaves rustling. I was overcome with a sense of awe and thankfulness. Now jump forward to 2018. I was having trouble reading signs and things at night. While driving I would see the "halos" from lights. Many of you have had the same experience. I had a cataract on my left eye and one just developing on my right eye. The left eye cataract was removed in 2018 and again I was amazed at the clarity it brought to my vision. Again, my response was one of awe and thanksgiving. In a real sense I was given new eyes and ears with which to experience life and God's wonderful creation.

I share that to encourage you to join us in reading through the Bible in 2022. For some of you it will be for the first time and for others it will be again. Regardless, as you begin to read God's word ask the Lord to open your spiritual eyes and ears to see and hear what He has for you. You might just hear and see things you have missed because your eyes were dimmed, and your ears muffled. How exciting would it be to see and hear the birds of God's Word chirping anew.

If you need a reading plan, we have one available at the church. The "YouVersion" Bible app has many reading plans that will take you through the Bible in a year. Find a plan that is comfortable to you and get started.

If you completed reading the Bible through in 2021, whether you took more than one year or not, please let the church office know. We want to celebrate this with you.

BTW, I ask for your prayers. I am scheduled to have the right cataract surgery on January 19, 2022.

My prayer is that we all have "eyes to see" and ears to hear" what God has for us in 2022.

Building good spiritual habits in 2022

Maybe you will put the deck away to pull out and use again next year, but my question is what have you learned or experienced that you can use going forward? Hopefully the simple exercise of reading a couple verses and asking a few questions has been fun or rich for your family. Maybe you found that making time to be together and being in God's Word brought new life or new questions into your family conversations.

We believe that God's Word is important and central to the life of the Church and the individuals and families who make up the body of Christ. Over the past many years we have encouraged habits of reading through the Bible in a year and memorizing a larger passage of scripture, we encourage you to continue in those or try again if you struggled. But this year, I'd like to encourage you to think about another habit: **discussing scripture as a family or group**.


A great tool to use if you don't know where to start is the YouVersion Bible app. Every day they post a verse of the day, a devotion and short teaching as well as a prayer. They usually provide a reflection question, but I'd encourage you at least to read that verse together as a family, discuss the reflection question and then allow someone to ask a random question that may or may not have anything to do with the verse. Two additional questions you can use are "what do you see in this verse?" and "what questions do you have after reading this?"

This is a starting point, you don't have to have all the answers, and actually your questions may show your kids that scripture still challenges you and that they are allowed to ask questions and then seek answers to them. I hope that your family grows to love God's Word and time together discussing it in this new year!
