

Every year, when the seasons move from winter to spring I am always awestruck. Prior to moving to West Virginia, the seasonal changes were either nearly nonexistent (Kenya & Bangladesh) or very slow and subtle (Oregon). Here though, in West Virginia, one goes to bed on a winter night and wakes up the next morning to spring. This sudden change from naked trees to colorful forests causes me to be filled with wonder each year. It is not just the beauty of spring that causes me to catch my breath in awe, but the suddenness in which it comes. Despite what we know about how seasons are caused by the earth rotation around the sun and the tilt of earth's axis towards the sun, along with relative latitudes with prevailing winds and so forth, the suddenness and beauty of spring is a mystery to me. The sudden beauty of spring is an unexplained wonder.

It is beautiful out today. The leafy branches hang over the roads, casting a wonderful light upon travelers. The cherry blossoms are in bloom with a beauty that is indescribable with any words that I know. The smell of cut grass is in the air, and the parks are full of people just enjoying the beauty of this world. Yet it seems but a week ago that I was throwing salt onto my drive way for fear of ice. This sudden change from the cold winds and the deadness of winter to the warmth, beauty and life of spring is an image of a mystery and hope that we have in Christ.

The Apostle Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 15 about this hope. He says in verses 51-53 "Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed-- in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will

be changed. For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality."

Can you imagine how beautiful being clothed with immortality will be? I am not sure my imagination is large enough to even begin to grasp the beauty, awe and glory of our own seasonal change from the perishable to imperishable. I think we will have bodies, but different. I think we will recognize and be recognizable, but in different ways. I think that if we could get but a glimpse of that future self, clothed with the imperishable we would laugh at the ways we try to make ourselves beautiful today. I think that no eye has seen the awesome, wonderful beauty of our spring in Christ.

Paul also says that this change from the perishable to the imperishable happens in but a moment, in a flash, a twinkle of an eye. What a profound image and hope. Clearly Paul is talking about the resurrection and the second coming of Christ in which all believers are caught up with Him. In a twinkling of an eye, we will go from winter to spring.

Yet even now, in our own lives and at this time, we get hints of this future Kingdom event. There can be days, even seasons of life that feel like winter. We feel unproductive, cold, gray and gloomy. Then all of a sudden, in God's timing and grace, we enter into an unexpected spring given to us by God's marvelous grace and creative power. Lives, young and old, blossom and proclaim God's handiwork.

As you enjoy the arrival of spring, may it be a reminder of not only God's faithfulness we witness year after year, but of the hope that you and I have in Christ; a hope of abundant life with Him into all of eternity, and a fullness of life in Him now.

### Thinking About My Mom

May, being the month of Mother's Day, finds me reflecting on my mom. Many of you knew her. Let me share some reflections on her:

We were walking in a mall somewhere in North Carolina one summer afternoon when I heard a child's voice yelling, "Miss Betty, Miss Betty!" Down the mall came a little boy my mom had taught in nursery school a couple of years before. He and his family had moved to North Carolina but he had not forgotten Miss Betty.

For nearly 30 years my mother taught in the Crossroads United Methodist Church's Nursery School. When she retired she had had students in 18 graduations and still had 12 more to come. For mom it was always a labor of love. In those hours each day she would, in word and deed, love and teach these children their lessons but most of all the love of Jesus.

In West Virginia she was known as a song leader at the West Virginia Baptist State Convention or the ABW Ministries Conference or at retreats or at camp. In her retirement she took numerous mission trips to Alaska, Eastern Europe and Central America. She served as a denominational leader. Her witness was consistent and strong throughout the years. Literally 100's, probably 1000's, of lives have been affected by her faithful witness.

You need to know she did not do this alone. Mom and Dad were a team and what they did they did as a team. One energized the other and lives were changed. There were three lives in particular. I am who I am today and in ministry today because of the heritage given to me by Bob and Betty Crouch. My commitment to Jesus and ministry is a result of their prayers, love and parenting. My sister, Jane was encouraged to use and develop her gifts in ministry, too. She went back to school after nearly twenty-five years and completed her degree in Education. She taught in public elementary schools in North Carolina and in her first year of teaching was nominated for "Teacher of the Year" in North Carolina. Now retired she continues to sing and serves as Choir Director in her church. When she sings, she lifts my heart to the edge of heaven. The third life is that of my closest friend for nearly over 50 years now. Roger Adams will tell you that my mom and dad had the most profound influence on his spiritual development. Roger was my mom's pastor for nine years before he left to plant a new church in Winfield and is now leading a church he planted in Lewisburg. Roger is a gifted pastor and leads more people to Christ than anyone I know. He really is part of our family, closer than a brother to me. I thank God for parents who chose to invest in the lives of others and to point those lives to ministry. THANKS MOM - I LOVE YOU AND MISS YOU.

So be on the lookout for our display in the back of the sanctuary and grab a bottle to fill.

**Operation Christmas Child:** We have been approved to be a local collection center for shoeboxes this Nov. more details will be coming as we near the time.

**Donations:** We have recently made donations to several ministries/organizations.

- Both Huntington East Middle School and Huntington High School food pantries were in need of spaghetti-o, ravioli, Raman, etc. we were able to supply them with quite a bit of food. HEMS was also in need of hygiene products which were supplied as well.
- Saints ministry is a ministry that takes a team of men into prisons to play baseball. But they are able to share
  much more than 9 innings. They play several games throughout the day but also get to share the gospel. From
  our church we have Mark Napier, Rob Ely and Caleb Wise playing this year. We were able to donate \$500 to
  their ministry.
- The **Campus Christian Center** is in need of maintenance/upgrades. We recently donated \$200 with the hope of giving more later in the year.
