"Work Out Your Salvation"

During the year of 2019 we at New Baptist Church have been working at memorizing a portion of Philippians 2 (verses 1-16). For the month of September our memory verse was verse 12 which reads "Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, so now, not only as in my presence but much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling." Every time we recite this verse each Sunday morning a part of me worries that people may misunderstand what this verse is saying. My worry is that when people read verse 12 they hear the verse say "work FOR your own salvation", or "work IN your own salvation" rather than what it does say which is "work OUT your own Working OUT one's salvation and salvation." working FOR one's salvation are two totally Working FOR my salvation different things. means that there are things that I need to do in order to be saved. That salvation is a product of my works. This is clearly wrong - as scripture tells us in multiple places that we are not saved by works but rather we are saved by God's grace. One example of where scripture tells us this is Ephesians 2:8–10 which reads "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."

So, what does "work OUT one's salvation" mean? It means to work OUT what God has worked IN. When a person is saved it is entirely an act of grace. We see many examples of salvation through grace in the New Testament with a great example in the thief on the cross. Clearly, there was nothing he could do to be saved; the capacity to do any works was literally removed from him by the fact that he was on a cross about to die but Jesus promised that he, a

thief, would be with in paradise (Luke 23:43). It is grace that saves. Yet, when a person is saved it is only the beginning of salvation. What I mean by this is that who you are when you are saved is different from who you shall be as one living in the

presence of God for all of eternity.

The Bible clearly tells us that God is holy and sin has no place in his sight or presence (see for example

Hebrews 12:24). This terrifies me not in that I may never see heaven (I trust in Jesus for that), but rather how much of me – my personality, my sense of identity or sense of personal being - is a product of sin. Or to say this in a different way - how much of you is a product of such things as pride, greed, anger, coveting, lust, sloth or gluttony? If such sins were removed from you, would you still be you? How much of you is defined by being in Christ (saved), and how much of you is still defined by current sinful ways of life? When Paul says in Philippians "work out your own salvation with fear and trembling," I hear him say to me that I am saved in Christ thus now I am to work out the power of that salvation into all areas of my life. As John the Baptist said about Jesus "I must decrease and he must increase (John 2:30)" is true of me as well. Jesus put it this way "For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it (Matthew 16:25)". The more my identity belongs to Jesus the more of me is truly me undistorted by sin. The more I work out what God has put in me the more I actually become the one that is born again to a new life. This transformation of self is a part of the gospel hope we have in Jesus Christ. It is why we are to pursue holiness which is simply another way to say "work out your own salvation with fear and trembling."

Family Life Moment

As we've recently celebrated a round of birthdays with our kids, I realized that I'm getting closer to parenting teenagers than I am to dealing with infants. Having worked with teens for more than a decade, I would think this might make me somewhat comfortable, but walking through this quickly changing world with so many teenagers and their parents, I am somewhat overwhelmed by the many issues and temptations that face the modern family. One thing I know for sure is that God is no less God and His Word is applicable and speaks truth no matter what is going on around us.

As a means of supporting families through a phase of parenting that is so formative and can be difficult we are offering to journey through a book together that lays out some basic foundational truths as it deals with big issues that face teenagers and their parents in today's culture. These truths are:

- 1. You (parents) are the most influential person in your teen's life
- 2. Your teen (even if they don't show it) wants you to be involving in their life.
- 3. No matter what is culturally accepted, nothing is more authoritative than the truth of God's Word.
- 4. You are a parent, not a pal.
- 5. You have to be willing to enter into discussions that make you uncomfortable.

Parenting is tough, but God has called you to this and privileged you with the opportunity to care for help your kids see God at work in their lives.
