Rejoice in Hope

What brings you joy? For many, it's those victorious moments and celebratory milestones that brighten our lives. Whether it's the day of graduation, the union of two souls in marriage, or the accomplishment of a personal goal, these occasions awaken a sense of

fulfillment that's hard to surpass. Life offers numerous opportunities for celebration:

- Achieving significant life goals or milestones, like earning a hard-earned diploma.
- Celebrating life's blessings, such as the sacred union of marriage.
- Personal triumphs, like shedding those extra pounds and embracing a healthier you.
- Ascending the professional ladder and relishing a welldeserved promotion.
- Encountering beauty, like when a soul-stirring melody fills the air.
- Special holidays, like Christmas, that unite families and communities in shared joy.
- Heartfelt thanksgiving, when our hearts overflow with gratitude for life's abundance.

These moments, whether grand or modest, weave together a tapestry of joy, imbuing our lives with depth and purpose.

Yet, amidst these tangible reasons for rejoicing, the apostle Paul, in Romans 12:12, encourages us to **"rejoice in hope."** Initially, this may seem paradoxical. How can we rejoice in something that has not yet been achieved,

It's a mindset that recognizes that though we may not see the full manifestation of God's promises today, we trust that they are on their way. It's an outlook that allows us to find joy

in the small victories, the steps forward, and the glimpses of God's faithfulness along the way.

Rejoicing in hope is an act of faith. It's declaring, "I believe that God is at work, even when I can't see it yet." Therefore, as Romans 12:12 exhorts us, "Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer."



Operation Christmas Child Update from Becky Crouch



Sitting down on the sand is Malaika, a 10-year-old girl from Kenya. She is among a few children in this region who cannot attend school due to poverty. When she recently received her gift-filled shoebox, Malaika was so happy to find books, pens, and other school items inside. She could not hide her excitement, shouting with joy "Jesus!

I am learning our American definition of a "Wow" item is different from the children in poverty, regions of war, and unreached people groups. We think of a stuffed animal, a doll or a soccer ball. A "Wow" item for them may be a toothbrush, school supplies, a picture of the family who packaged the shoebox, or a note/letter that was enclosed.

Thanks to you and the generosity of others in our congregation many children will be receiving "Wow" items of all kinds. I am amazed at the number of items being donated. It appears that we will have more than 300 boxes to pack at our party on **Wednesday, November 8**. Praise God!

We will still receive items through October, so it is not too late for you to participate. Cards with suggested items are on the table in the lobby if you are looking for ideas.

We are also accepting money for shipping. \$10 is the requested donation for each box to cover shipping costs, training of national leaders who present the gospel at shoebox distribution sites, and the materials used for discipleship training. If we pack 300 boxes, we would like to donate \$3000. Please pray about how you can be involved.

On September 24th we celebrated our 15th anniversary as New Baptist Church. The creation of New Baptist is a story to be celebrated and shared. Most often we Baptists multiply by division. Two historic churches in Huntington, Twentieth Street Baptist and Beverly Hills Baptist, examined their current ministry and situations and decided to merge and see what more could be done together as one congregation rather than two separate congregations. The result of that coming together is a thriving church making a difference for the Lord in our community. I am honored to be part of the pastoral staff for nearly eight years. I grew up at Highlawn Baptist. A church plant in the east end of Huntington out of the Twentieth Street Baptist Church in 1914. I had three pastors there, Dr. Norman Lewis, Rev. Although these three had a profound influence on me a far greater influence was by the many couples that poured their lives into us as children and young people. My heart swells with gratitude as I think about them. The Goodalls, Burgesses, Jones, Parsons, Barnetts, Blakes, Porters, Birds, Ellises, Vincents and Crouches . I am sure there were others but the point is the spiritual impact they had on us. **On October 14 we are having a Highlawn Baptist Reunion at the Church building on Collis Ave**. St. Mary's and Mountain Health are allowing us to use the building for the reunion. Even though the ones that impacted me are with the Lord, I look forward to re-connecting with so many that I grew up with and those that came after I left Huntington in 1970. If you were part of Highlawn Baptist mark the date and come join the fun of reconnecting at the Reunion.

October 15 is an important date to me. It is Becky's birthday and also the date of my mother's death. These two women have impacted my life more than any others. My mom, "Miss Betty", modeled and taught me the faith lessons that still sustain me today. She and my Dad made faith a priority in their lives and modeled it for my sister and me. I am so honored when someone asks, "Are you Miss Betty's son?" Yes, I am. Becky's love for me has made me a better man, husband, father, grandfather, pastor and friend. The scripture tells us Proverbs 18:22 (ESV) He who finds a wife finds a good thing and obtains favor from the LORD, and Proverbs 12:4 (ESV) An excellent wife is the crown of her husband... Both of those are true for me. I am surely blessed.

I have reflected long enough but I hope this will cause you to do the same. It is good to look back and reflect because it encourages us with a sure hope as we move forward.
