# "A Father's Advice"

At the end of August, Joshua flew to India. It was hard to see my 18-year-old high school graduate leave the country for a year. When we said good-bye, I handed him a letter that I had written him. A part of that letter was a list of personal requests and instructions. My last shot of being a parent before he leaves home. Reading through this list made me think that it is not just good advice for Joshua, but also for many others either leaving home, attending college, or just needing direction in life. Here is my list of requests, instructions, and advice for Joshua.

- Be faithful to read and enjoy God's word.
- Write your mom and me often.
- Go to church.
- Trust the Lord in your romantic relationships. His timing and plan is truly best. Trust Him.
- Write your mom and me often.
- Don't compartmentalize your faith or separate it from your everyday, moment-by-moment life. You can live life with great courage in Jesus. You have no need to be scared of anything for He is with you. He has been so faithful in your life—remember His faithfulness and what He has done.
- Enjoy the journey, but be sure to slow down on the curves or you will crash.
- Know that I will always love you with a love that is not earned nor can be lost. My love for you is not dependent upon what you do or do not do. I just love you. And if I can love you with such love, think how much more does the Father in Heaven love you.
- Live generously.
- Live graciously.
- Practice patience.
- Enjoy the people the Lord puts in your path.

- Be wise in personal body care while in India (i.e food, water, cleaning). In Kenya, I went there thinking I was invincible and thus had the mumps, malaria, and hepatitis in a period of one month. Don't be like me in this regard. Being healthy will provide much more numerous positive experiences than being sick. Practice what you know of safe food and proper hygiene. Be vigilant.
- Find a few things that you really enjoy (example: a tea, a food, a place) where you can pause to pray, read scripture, and enjoy the Lord. This is really important.
- Don't be afraid to express your needs.
- When in dense crowds its ok to push a little to get where you need to go.
- It is ok to not get cheated. Stand up for yourself when people are taking advantage of you.
- It is ok to get cheated. If a person is in real need, pay what they ask, give what they need.
- Champion the poor, push back against those that abuse their position or power.
- Beware of strangers that make promises or give gifts, they want something from you. Don't agree to anything until the costs are clear up front
- Protect your passport.
- A sense of humor is the greatest way to deal with chaos.
- Please greet and thank your host family for me.
- And, please write your mom and me often.



# **Family Life Moment**



I can remember so vividly my first college soccer game, being out on the field and amidst the murmur of the crowd, there was an eerie silence. This was the first time I could remember my dad not being at one of my sporting events. He had coached years of soccer, and his voice always stood out as a trusted source to tell me when to kick or hold my place as I rounded the last turn at a track meet. Even in noisy stadiums, my dad's voice reminded me of his presence and his encouragement that helped me to run faster or play harder.

I had so much taken this for granted until all of a sudden I was playing games nearly a day's drive away from my parents and their absence was noticeable.

It is amazing how the presence of someone can bring strength, encouragement, and confidence. I don't say this as a means of guilting parents who aren't able to make all their kids sporting events, but as a reminder of the power of our presence with our kids and families. As I read scripture, I am reminded of the power of God's presence and the gift we have to experience it regularly. In Exodus 33, God is asking Moses to lead the people into the promised land. Moses, fearful of the proposition and of being alone, asks God how he can know for sure. In verse 14 God says "My presence will go with you, and I will give you rest." It is the revelation of the presence of God with Moses that leads him forward.

Later we see God's presence come and settle into the temple, where people can come and worship and offer sacrifices. This is a central location that draws the people of God together around the presence of God. But after the destruction of the temple and the scattering of Israel, Isaiah promised a future savior who would be born named Immanuel, God with us. And Jesus comes, as John 1:14 says, as the "Word became flesh and dwelt among us." And then even Jesus' last words on earth in Matthew 28:20 "I am with you always, to the end of the age."

We have this promise of God's presence as we live in relationship with Jesus. We no longer have to go to a single location to be in God's presence, but he is with us wherever we go through the Holy Spirit. With that in mind, we also carry his presence with us wherever we go. And the encouragement that was given to Moses at the brink of a tough transition, God promises to go with us, and from that promise we find strength to go where he is calling us.

I'm grateful for loving parents in my life, but even more, I'm grateful that my parents led me to have a relationship with Jesus, so that when I launched into the world on my own, I was never alone, because a more powerful presence than my dad's was with me.

How can you point your kids to experience God's presence in their life? How are you experiencing God's presence in your own life? How can we resource you to grow in your faith as you experience God's presence and point your children toward faith in Jesus and teach them to experience his presence in their lives?

This is an ongoing process, and I want to continue to walk with you as we grow together toward maturity in Christ. Thank you for being faithful to walk with me and others who are growing and learning to follow Jesus!

**July Mission Dinner:** Thank you for continuing to be a generous church. The Wednesday mission dinner in July collected money for Katelyn McGuffin's internship with Cru at Marshall University.

**August Mission Luncheon:** The mission luncheon in August collected over \$400.00 for Pastor Dasnis! Pastor Dasnis was able to update us during a Wednesday evening service this past month. It is always a blessing to hear how the Lord is working in Haiti. Thank you for your continued support for his ministry which allows Pastor Dasnis to be a full-time pastor. Being full-time allows him to be available for the congregation daily.

**Wednesday September 27** – Will be our next mission evening service. Please join us for dinner at 5:30 then stay for the evening service at 6:30 to hear about a ministry we as a church support in our community.

#### **Service Updates:**



**Food Pantry:** In July the food pantry continued to server our community in a mighty way. The number of families/individuals this ministry is able to serve is amazing. In July they were able to serve 203 families, totaling 470 people

made up of 130 children, 244 adults, 96 senior adults, all for a total of 7,050 meals (they were closed on July 4 otherwise numbers would be even higher). Hygiene kits are being distributed every other month so none were distributed in July. They were also able to serve 33 homeless individuals. The Food Pantry has changed how they are serving the homeless. They are now putting an emphasis on proteins instead of carbs and making sure items are easy to store and prepare. Here is an example of the items given to our homeless: 2 cans of fruit, 1 bottle of juice/Gatorade, 2 cans of meat, 2 cans of stew or chili, 2 cans of soup, 2 cans of beans, 1 jar of peanut butter/month, 1 jar of jelly/month, toilet paper, crackers, snacks (nutriagrain bars or similar, hygiene kit/month, cheese/month. As you can see this is an extensive list to help keep our homeless from being hungry. Our food pantry ministry continues to look for help every week but especially on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tues of every month as that is the day food is delivered. If you have a truck that can help pick up the deliveries or you are willing to help unload the trucks please see Joyce Mannon for details on how to become involved. In addition to the large food delivery on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of each month, the food pantry is now also adding an additional box of food for 30 senior citizens each month.

**Backpack Giveaway:** Continued thanks for your generosity with the back to school supplies. You all always go above and beyond. We were able to donate 100 backpacks full of supplies to the backpack giveaway at Community of Grace Methodist Church. We were then able to deliver 100 backpacks full of supplies to our local schools (Highlawn Elementary, Huntington East Middle School and Huntington High School) to be given to those students in need. We also were able to donate a TON of extra supplies to each school as well.

#### **Service Opportunities:**



**Fall Festival:** The Fall Festival is fast approaching. Candy corn M&Ms and Reese pumpkins have already been spotted in stores. Our annual Fall Festival will be held on Saturday October 28 from 12-2. Last year we were able to welcome 1500 people onto our church property. Through our decorated trunks and animated storytellers

1500 people were able to experience a walk through the Bible with different stories. Those that registered and asked for prayer have been prayed for continually over the last year. This event is a HUGE outreach opportunity for our church. We need EVERYONE to be involved. We need over 100 volunteers on event day, but can use helpers prior to the event as well. The only requirement is a willing heart. If you have that

we can find a job for you. Jobs include: registration, set-up/clean-up, greeters, cake bakers, food makers/servers, games, crafts, storytellers, trunk decorators, prayers, follow-uppers (I think I just created that word). If you are interested in helping please fill out the volunteer form at the welcome center or in the bulletin and turn into either the church office or Bethany Cox. WE NEED EVERYONE! Watch the bulletin for more information. We will collect candy donations in October.

Reed Family: The Reeds have continued to stay very busy. Grace, the oldest daughter, has started at Marshall University! Prayer for her and her parents are greatly appreciated. JD is currently teaching as an adjunct professor in the Palmer Seminary Masters of Theological Studies Online Spanish Program. He will be moving in an administrative role as well helping as an administrator/student advisor for the Latin American groups. JD also continues to working with the administration of the House of Hope Foundation in Bolivia as they are working to open a second location in Santa Cruz in the coming year or two.

This summer they had three interns in Cochabamba to help strengthen the ministry there. One was our very own, Kasey Madden. Kasey was able to help develop a new website for the House of Hope. Be sure to check it out atwww.hohbolivia.org. Way to go Kasey! The Reeds were also able to host two church groups this summer. They partnered with the Emmanuel Foundation (Goretty Jora's foundation) to build a reclaimed/recycled tire playground for the kids at their farm outside the city. The Emmanuel Foundation is a ministry on the south side of Cochabamba that works specifically with the children of the prostitutes in the red light district. They typically work with about 50 kids per day.

**Katelyn McGuffin:** Katelyn has raised all of her support for the next year! As Marshall has just started fall classes she is just getting started with her internship. Please be in prayer for her as she engages with international students this coming year.
