The Summer Blockbuster

Every year movie studios release multi-million-dollar-Hollywood blockbusters for movie goers to enjoy. I must confess, I like a good story. In fact, I am more driven by an interesting and creative story than I am by special effects or action. Stories help me learn and see things from different perspectives, they allow me to wonder and laugh, and even sometimes cry. Yet, at the end of the roughly 2-hour show, the projector turns off and the lights come on, and all that is left is to talk about is the experience of seeing the movie. The movie itself (usually) is fiction, or, if it is not fiction, it is a story about someone else, which means it is still fiction to me. There are many wonderful stories, but none of them are mine. *My story is better.*

My story is about a Loving God who created the world simply because He is a loving God. A God who is in Himself relational (Father, Son and Spirit), and thus man and woman are created to live in the presence of God, enjoying Him, and giving him Glory forever. But, man and woman, became deceived thinking that God was holding back on them and thus to be happy they needed to disobey God. (This deception persists even today.) The consequence of failing to trust and obey God resulted in a relational separation from God, the very creator and source of life. Because of that separation man and woman live in a world marked by suffering and under the bondage of death and decay of all things. This is why, despite the desire of the human heart for a better world, unspeakable suffering and atrocities continue to this day.

God did not leave us. From the very beginning God has been at work in revealing Himself, most importantly through the testimony of His people (the Israelites), the giving of His Law, and the proclamation of the Prophets. All of

these witnesses of God have worked to reveal who God is, and to open our eyes to our own enslaved and depraved condition. Finally, in these last days, God spoke one final word through the Son sent to save us. Jesus was the full and complete revelation of God because He is God. Yet Jesus was more than just a better witness of God, He did something that the law and the prophets could not do. Jesus delivered people from their sins and the bondage of death and decay. This deliverance was accomplished by Jesus himself dying upon a cross, taking the full wrath, and curse of separation and death upon Himself. Therefore, by this staggering gift given, we are made free to live in the presence of God, enjoying Him, and forever giving Him glory. How do I know that this story is true? It is true because Jesus rose from the grave. His resurrection vindicates all that he taught, all that he did, and all that he accomplished.



This is my story. It is my story lived by faith. A faith that not only believes the truth of this story, but lives according to the reality of the story. A faith that not only finds rest in being a beloved child of God, but a faith that seeks to become that which I already am. A faith that looks forward to Christ's return as the start of even a greater story.

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. (Hebrews 12:1,2 NIV)

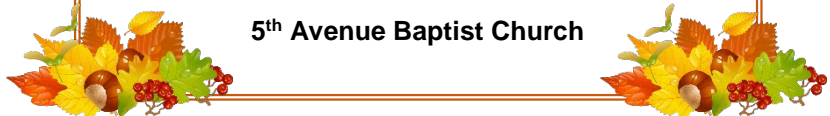

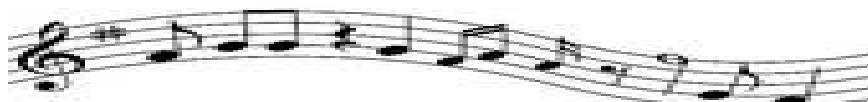

Finding Your Story in God's Story

Summer is nearly past and a new school year has started. We too are beginning a new year of spiritual activities here at the church. Now that we are out of the main vacation season it is time to get back to church. We all need those times of renewal and refreshment that vacations bring but now it is time to be sure that we are in worship with our church family each week.

If I were to ask you what the over-arching story of the Bible is, could you answer that in a coherent way? How does the Old Testament lead into the New Testament? What connections are there between the two testaments? The Bible is the best-selling book in history, but how many people in our community are actually reading it? A Gallup survey reports the average American household has four Bibles. However, research by Pew Forum on Religion and Public Life (2008) found that only 16 percent of Americans read the Bible every day.

To reverse that trend we have encouraged and challenged you to read the Bible through each year. To enhance your understanding of the Bible you are invited to join with the Harvesters Sunday School Class for a journey through the Story of the Bible. This study will increase your Biblical literacy and help you understand God's story from Genesis to Revelation. One of the exciting outcomes of this study is recognizing where your personal story intersects with God's.

We will begin this study on Sunday, September 16. This study will take us through the Spring of next year.

I have the honor of leading this study and invite you to find your story in God's story.

Thank You:

Thank you for your continued generosity for Pastor Dasnis. Our luncheon this past Sunday collected \$505; making our yearly total \$3,219.38!!! Thank you for continuing to support his ministry in Haiti. Pastor Dasnis visited with us at our last meeting and it is always so uplifting to hear what all he is able to accomplish with our support.

Mission Reports:

Baby Bottles: In May was a church collected money for a New Beginning Crisis Pregnancy Center. We have finally received our total donation. We were able to collect \$1,043.14. Our spare change can make quite a difference in the lives of young moms in our neighborhood. Thank you for supporting this ministry.



Back Pack Collections: Thanks to everyone who donated backpacks, supplies, money or time packing the packs. We were able to meet our goal of 200 filled backpacks. We collected over our goal!!! Amy Kelly has delivered these to Huntington High School, Huntington East Middle School and Highlawn Elementary.

Food Pantry: For the months of June and July our food pantry was able to service 512 families totaling 1,135 people (348 children, 615 adults, 142 seniors). They were also able to assist 78 homeless and distributed 305 hygiene kits. They are also getting ready to start the backpack ministry at Highlawn Elementary. They have been providing 50 back packs/week, but this year we will be increasing that number to 60/week.

Fall Festival: New Baptist Church will be hosting our annual Fall Festival Trunk and Treat on Saturday October 27. Go ahead and mark your calendars so you will be sure to be able to help. We are needing a minimum of 100 volunteers for that event. We are looking for volunteers to decorate a trunk, be the storyteller for each trunk, bake cakes, help with setup/clean up, registration, games, crafts, inflatable games, prayer booth, greeters and serve food. There is a job for everyone. Basically, if you are breathing we will find a job for you! Please fill out the volunteer forms at the welcome center or in the bulletin and turn into myself or the church office. These will be available in the near future. Keep watch in the bulletin for more details.

Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes: You may think this is early to be mentioning OCC shoeboxes, however, this is the perfect time to start thinking and planning your shoebox. Right now back to school items are significantly cheaper than in November. Go ahead and purchase a box of crayons for \$0.50 instead of \$1.50 later. Find memo pads or colored pencils cheaper now. Stock up on supplies to fill your boxes while the price is right!

God instructs us through the prophet, Malachi, to “Bring the full tithes into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house ...” Malachi 3:10 (ESV). In 2 Corinthians 9:8 (ESV), Paul writes “Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.”

Payment methods have changed dramatically in the “digital world”. So, for those of you who do not carry cash or a personal checkbook on your person, here are four additional ways to give to New Baptist Church:

1. Most banks and credit unions offer a free electronic “Bill Pay” service. In essence, your bank will mail the church a bank issued check for you. All you have to do is set up a reoccurring payment (weekly, bi-weekly, semi-monthly, or monthly), using your bank’s mobile app or its website, for the amount you want to give to New Baptist Church. Our mailing address is 610 – 28th Street, Huntington, WV 25702.  Bill Pay
2. For customers of larger banks, you can use the free “Zelle” service. It works similar to the “Bill Pay”, except it eliminates the mailing of a paper check. The money is transferred electronically between bank accounts. All you have to do is set up a “Zelle” reoccurring payment (weekly, bi-weekly, semi-monthly, or monthly), using your bank’s mobile app or its website, for the amount you want to give to New Baptist Church. 3. You can donate to New Baptist Church through our website, www.newbaptistchurch.com. We have a donate button on our web page. Click on the donate button, follow the instructions, and give to New Baptist Church through our PayPal account. **(PayPal reduces your contribution to us by 2.2% for processing your card payment.)** 
4. We have a debit/credit card reader in the church office. See Pat Baisden about using your card(s) to give to New Baptist through our PayPal account. **(PayPal reduces your contribution to us by 2.2% for processing your card payment.)**

The Challenge of Scripture

GQ magazine recently included the Bible on a list of 21 books not worth reading, calling the text “repetitive” and “foolish” (among other things). Pushback came from both secular and religious folks. Writing in *USA Today*, Tim Swarens argued that even if you don’t believe in God, the Bible helps you understand Western culture, history, current events and your neighbors.

For Christians, the Bible — God’s inspired Word — reveals God’s love and will. It isn’t always easy to read or process, but no other book contains such good news.

As Danielle Shroyer writes in *Original Blessing*, “Scripture is a sacred book meant to provoke us in ways that will move us toward God. And often, that is the very last thing we are looking for. We would rather have an answer, a simple plan, even a nicely tidy moral story. But Scripture gives us none of these things, because the holy is anything but domestic. We go looking to find a plan and instead are sent on a treasure hunt.”

A Legacy of Faith

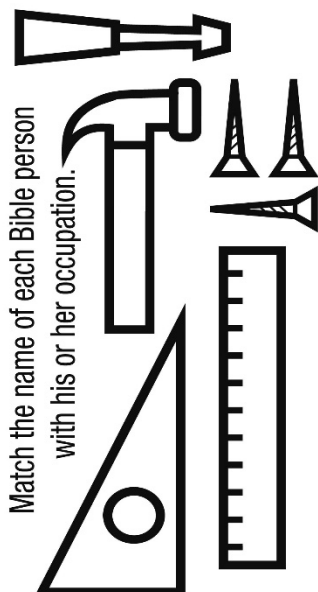
